Our guest speaker will be Linda Pullen, a fellow Dane fancier and canine masseuse. She will demonstrate canine massage using any available Dane. Here's a bit about what Linda has to say about herself, her experience and Great Danes.

"I moved to Santa Rosa from Fayetteville, Arkansas, although I have lived in California before. I've been licensed in Arkansas in massage since 1994, and as a Master Massage Therapist since 1997. I've been certified in canine massage since 1995, and have offered both that service as well as canine massage seminars since that time.

"I got hooked on Great Danes in 1992, with my first Dane and show dog, Ch. Jamara's Chance Von Shrado. Once I started showing him, I fell in love with the camaraderie I found at the dog shows. Chance was followed by his daughter, Ch. Toto's Sabrina V Kacheke, who I eventually co-owned with Susan Hoke. I am currently owned by an almost 8-year-old bitch, Glory, out of my one and only breeding.

"I've been a member of the GDCA since 1994, and a member of the Greater Dallas Great Dane Club as well. In 1996, I got divorced and my lifestyle changed! I've attended some shows but have not actively shown since. I'm looking forward to getting back into showing and plan on looking for a male show puppy within the next few years."

Friday, April 23rd:

- **Setup** begins at **noon** on Friday please don't arrive before that time! We'll set up the obedience & conformation rings and get the dining room ready, too. Please make yourself available wherever you see a need. Thanks!
- Match entries will be accepted starting at 2:30pm with judging by Ms. Diane McClelland to begin at 4pm. The youngest puppy class is 3-6 months – be sure your babies have their vaccines!
- **Puppy Evaluation:** At the conclusion of the match there will be an informal evaluation of 8 week-old puppies. Please feel free to observe and/or participate.
- **BBQ Potluck**: Coals will be lit at the conclusion of the set up. The Club will provide hotdogs with buns and condiments. Please bring something to share for 4-6 of your fellow Club members and exhibitors.

Saturday, April 24th:

- **Obedience** will start at 8:30am in the ring where conformation judging was last year. Please bring a chair and root on the obedience participants!
- Sweepstakes will commence at 9:00am (not at 8:00am as indicated in the Premium List) with Ms. Bert Rettick judging our entries.
- **Conformation** judging is expected to get under way around 10:15am with Ms. Gina Jaeblon judging. Lunch will be at her discretion but will most likely begin after dogs are judged. Please get your **meal tickets** from Ann English she needs your meal reservations by April 10th.
- Junior showmanship will be held on Saturday only.
- Relax... There should be plenty of time for you to unwind after the show, get your pictures taken, feed and exercise your dogs.
- **Dinner & Auction:** We are planning on a 6:30pm start time for the dinner which will be catered and is an "all you can eat" affair. There will be no program this year but the auction following dinner promises to be a good one. Ms. Jane Chopson is again the outstanding auctioneer.

- Conformation judging begins at 8:30am with Mr. Leon Reimert judging both regular and non-regular classes.

In conjunction with the Specialty Shows, GDCNC will be having an AKC-Sanctioned Breed Match judged by Diane McClelland. We'll be accepting day-of-match entries **only** starting at 2:30pm on Friday, April 23rd, with judging scheduled to start at 4pm. We've opened entries up to puppies as young as 3-months old – please be sure your precious little ones are properly vaccinated.

Classes will be divided by sex and include: Puppy (3-6 months, 6-9 months, and 9-12 months), Junior(12-18 months), and Open (over 18-months). Ribbons and toy prizes will be awarded to the top four exhibits in each class. Rosettes will go to Best Puppy, Best Opposite Sex to Best Puppy, Best Junior, Best Opposite Sex to Best Junior, Best Adult, and Best Opposite Sex to Best Adult with additional recognition to Best in Match. The cost is \$10 per entry. It promises to be great fun!!!

We will be making a poster with a list of the names of all who donate (everything counts!) and displaying it at the raffle table. We are hoping for a LONG list!



Question: How do you make a small fortune breeding dogs?

Answer: Start with a very large fortune!

Flea Free, Naturally

From some Collie folks in hot South Texas – people who use it say they've never seen a flea or tick on their dogs or cats!

- Take a BIG fat lemon (the more rind the better) and slice it paper thin.
- Put in a bowl with a tablespoon of crushed rosemary leaves (or a 6 inch sprig of fresh).
- Pour a guart of hot, near boiling water over the lemon/rosemary mixture.
- Let steep overnight.
- Strain and put into a large spray bottle.
- Keep in fridge.
- Shake well before applying. The d-lemeone in this spray along with the rosemary oil will give your dog a beautiful shiny coat and keep fleas and other bugs away (including mosquitoes, so you get extra heartworm protection).

If your dog has dry skin or allergies add a teaspoon of tea tree oil and a tablespoon of Aloe pulp. Use the spray at least twice a week to keep the scent on the coat to repel bugs, and spray it around your doors and through the carpets. If it's a bad flea time, spray daily on the belly and feet to repel them. This has worked wonders for many years – and not only for the dogs, but for people, too, when hiking or walking in the woods. No bug will get near this stuff. And, of course, it's all natural.
