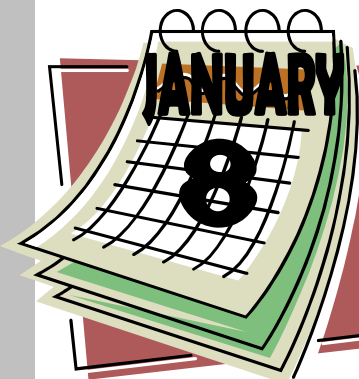

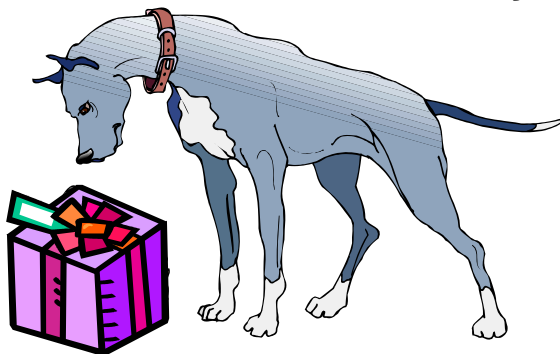

The Turkey Circuit shows have historically drawn majors in our Breed – just about the only Northern California majors in recent years besides the GDCNC Specialties. This year, however, majors held only on Sunday – enough to finish one dog and get a much-needed first major for another.

The Golden Valley Kennel Club shows were the Friday and Saturday before Thanksgiving in Turlock. On Friday, Judge Faye Strauss awarded Charlie (Tered's Confidential Affair, owned and bred by Terri and Eddie Hammond) Winners Dog and Best of Winners. Winners Bitch (for two points) went to Winnie (Paradise's Winning Ways, owned and bred by Vince and Joan Mulligan). On Saturday, Judge Cecilia Ringstrom found Kathleen's Davis's Furst (Furst D'Shire Von Der Ofnethohle) for WD and BOW, and Winnie took WB for the second day in a row.

After judging on Saturday, exhibitors packed up and moved their setups to Stockton for Sunday's and Monday's San Joaquin Kennel Club shows. Judge Ronald R. Krohne chose Jazz (Valinor's All That Jazz MVP) as Winners Dog – a 3-point major that completed his championship. In bitch judging, major points were awarded to WB/BOW Nike (Olympus' Sweet Victory, owned by breeders Denise and Brittany Williams). On Monday, two-points were up for grabs in bitches – and Judge Charles Schaefer awarded them to Meribel (Shady Oaks Mardi Gras Meribel, the lovely brindle spoiled by Gail Hunt). Winners Dog was Scout (Amador's Suletawv, owned by Robin Miller and breeder Michele Andreeta); Scout picked up two-points by going BOW as well.

Oscar (CH Sasdania-Vitag's Frozen Asset, owned by Lorraine Matherly, Jane Chopson and breeders David A. Vitagliano and Steve Stevens) swept Breed honors all four days, picking up a Group 2 on Saturday.

Dear Friends,

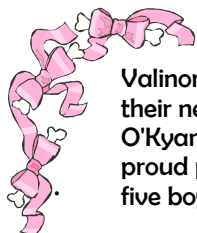

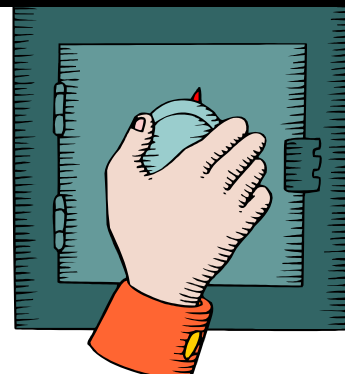
